O Lord, my heart is not lifted up, my eyes are not raised too high; I do not occupy myself with things too great and too marvelous for me.

But I have calmed and quieted my soul, like a child with its mother; my soul is like the child that is with me. O Israel, hope in the Lord

from this time on and forevermore. Psalm 131

During the Wednesday evenings of Lent this year, we've been using this Psalm, Psalm 131, as the guiding principle for our thoughts. We've been talking of things like quieting our souls, quieting our appetites, quieting our consciences, etc. *Quiet* is not an easy discipline for us, as we're so accustomed to a noisy existence.

As part of my own "quieting" discipline this year, I've been trying to find time each day to get out and just walk... not run, which an angry Achilles tendon screams against my doing. For so many years I've been a slave to the watch and to hitting pace targets, and it's an entirely different experience for me to simply slow down and move intentionally, quietly, meditatively. (I still find myself checking my watch, comparing one day's walk with another, as though there are medals to be won from beating yesterday's walk time. I'm hopeless (3) Not everyone is like this...

From the time he was little, my youngest son has been an "outside guy." As a preschooler he could spend hours in the back yard exploring or happily sitting in a snowbank in his snow suit, moving piles of snow from here to there with a little shovel. Just let him be outside, and all was well.

His fascination with the great outdoors and the wonders it holds meant that he was a "slow walker"... and still is. This can sometimes be an enervating thing if you're accompanying him and you yourself are more "destination oriented," like you know where you want to go and you're just trying to get there as fast as possible. Good luck with that, as he stops to look at that ground squirrel, or photograph that flower, or listen to that bird, or...

John Muir, an environmental champion and pioneer of conservation, once wrote: "In every walk with nature one receives far more than he seeks." The boy knows this without having read it. When you're surrounded by wonders too great and marvelous for you, the only proper thing to do is slow down and quiet oneself, and then be open to receive far more than you imagined when you took that first step on the journey.

As we approach the week we call "Holy," from Palm Sunday through Maundy Thursday to Good Friday to Holy Saturday, I would encourage you to think of it as a walk in the woods... and slow down, and to quiet down. To recite once again the story of the lengths our Lord would go to reveal his love for us... this is holy ground we're treading. To rush through it on the way to Easter would be to miss the essential mysteries that define the destination.

As part of that slow-down, quiet-down walk, consider joining us for worship on those days (the schedule is here in this newsletter and on our website). Quiet your soul... from the tumultuous noise that rages around us constantly... and reignite your hope in the One who is with us in all of it, leading us to far more than we seek.




