`But you were always a good man of business, Jacob,' faltered Scrooge, who now began to apply this to himself.

`Business!' cried the Ghost, wringing its hands again. `Mankind was my business. The common welfare was my business; charity, mercy,

forbearance, and benevolence, were, all, my business. The dealings of my trade were but a drop of water in the comprehensive ocean of my business!'

It held up its chain at arm's length, as if that were the cause of all its unavailing grief and flung it heavily upon the ground again.

'At this time of **the rolling year**,' the spectre said 'I suffer most. Why did I walk through crowds of fellow-beings with my eyes turned down, and never raise them to that blessed Star which led the Wise Men to a poor abode! Were there no poor homes to which its light would have conducted me!' (p. 8, "A Christmas Carol" by Charles Dickens)

Dear Friends,

I've always been partial to Charles Dickens' phrase "the rolling year," as found here in this little snippet of his work, "A Christmas Carol," featuring the haunted miser Ebenezer Scrooge. "The rolling year" well describes this 12-month, 52-week, 365-day, 525,600-minute chunk of time that we now mark with December's end and January's genesis. As much as we might be led to believe that time is a straight-line, linear experience, it's actually a circuit: once more around the sun, once more to seasons that have come and gone before, another trip around the block, as it were. The *rolling* year.

And as each year rolls, each brings with it plenty of opportunities... opportunities to grab hold of or to ignore, to rejoice in or to grieve, to take a chance or to let slip, to be brave or to be cowardly. You know this, if you've made enough revolutions around the sun yourself.

In the liturgical calendar, it just so happens that the first festival in January of every year is that of the Epiphany of our Lord (January 6). It refers us to the story from Matthew's Gospel of how a star appeared over the home of the Christ child, leading a trio of Eastern astrologers to come searching for this new king whose birth the star must signify. They come with their gifts, with their worship, to "a poor abode" that must have looked nothing like what they would have imagined for a newborn king's nursery.

In the story of Ebenezer Scrooge, the ghost of Jacob Marley (Scrooge's former business partner, now seven years dead) visits him on Christmas Eve to warn him of his fate, should he continue in his miserly, selfish, grasping path.

As Marley's ghost is scaring the bejeezus out of Scrooge, he gives one of the most eloquent interpretations of the Epiphany I've ever come across:

"Why did I walk through crowds of fellow-beings with my eyes turned down, and never raise them to that blessed Star which led the Wise Men to a poor abode! Were there no poor homes to which its light would have conducted me!"

In essence, he's reminding Scrooge (and us) that the star isn't just a waypoint to a new king. The circumstances of Jesus' birth, the very incarnation itself, announces God's presence and favor most immediately with the small, the poor, the downtrodden... those of no account by most of the world's

reckoning. Marley confesses that he never bothered to look up from his own concerns, his own "business," for if he had, perhaps that star would have led him to where something of worth might truly be found... in the needs of a neighbor.

Just as those who first followed this star some two millennia ago, so we embark on another trip through the rolling year. As a church seeking Jesus where he may be found, I can think of no better counsel to offer than Marley's ghost offered Scrooge: that our proper business be "the common welfare... charity, mercy, forbearance and benevolence." The Epiphany, the "shining forth" of God's presence, right here with us, would guide us right into the heart of the world's need. Let's not neglect to look up.

Do not let your heart be troubled, and do not be afraid." ~ John 14:27







EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Our Savior's Lutheran Church Council Minutes


Tuesday, December 10, 2023 - 6:30 PM

- 1. **Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order by Andy Binder at 6:31 PM. Members present were Dave Pummel, Karson Klein, Pam Tyma, Reed Haug, Sherry Kloeckl, Christina Miles, Andy Binder, with Deacon Laura Campbell, and Pastor Stephan Sandness.
- 2. **Devotions:** Karson Klein reflected on trusting in God's timing and having faith in God's plan. He noted how easy it is to say we trust in God, but it is often harder to actually do so. We hear each note of music at a time, God hears all of them at the same time. Karson continued with the news that he and his wife have recently adopted a son, Luca.
- 3. **Approve Agenda:** Christina Miles moved to approve the agenda as presented; Pam Tyma seconded; motion carried.
- 4. **Approval of the November Council Minutes:** Christina Miles moved to approve the November Council minutes as presented; Sherry Kloeckl seconded; motion carried.
- 5. **Approval of the May Treasurer's Report:** Treasurer Dave Pummel, presented the treasurer's report provided. November income was \$51,552 with expenses of \$67,625. Year-to-date income stands at \$545,094.73 with expenses of \$552,539. Leaving a year-to-date balance of -\$7,444, which is far better than last year's balance of approximately-\$40,000. Overall this year is excellent. Dave did make note we recently paid for annual property insurance and umbrella insurance, \$12,264 and \$1,050 respectively. Pam Tyma moved to approve the report as presented; Karson Klein seconded; motion carried.
- 6. **Ministerial Staff Reports:** Deacon Laura shared how this time of the year can be full of joy and full of sorrow. She shared how great it was in the kitchen for Julefest with a great number of youth learning from the "older" members and sharing in fellowship. Friendship ministry has been making many contacts. Anyone interested in joining the Friendship ministry is encouraged to reach out at any time. Deacon Laura shared the joy of seeing many new babies added to the cradle role. The Advent devotionals have been out for a few weeks and have been well received. Eighteen people have been involved in the Advent Bible study being held online and in-person.

Pastor Stephan Sandness reported Julefest went great. He noted how great it is to see so many hands come together to pull it off. Generation teaching generation how the event is done. A highlight of Pastor Stephan's month was officiating a wedding, his only wedding of the year. Wednesday Word has been well attended and focused on the Prophet Isaiah. We have recently accepted around two dozen new members, a number of which are young families. Lutheran Campus Ministries is continuing their search for a new Director. While they have recently interviewed a potential candidate, they have chosen to continue their search. Both confirmation and youth group are going very well. Pastor Stephan reminded everyone we have four Christmas Eve services coming up. Anyone interested in helping with communion or ushering is encouraged to sign-up on the board in the fellowship hall.

- 7. **Committee Reports:** Education council has been communicating and preparing for the holiday season events. Properties committee report on how helpful the fix-it group truly is for our church. They also note some fascia has recently blown off the building in the wind. Work is in progress to fix the area of concerns. There is no risk to the building at this time. Senior ministry will be holding a Christmas party this Thursday. Mission Team note Angel Tree, gift cards, and quilts for Pine Ridge are all being wrapped up this week. They are starting plans for this coming March. Communications committee will be working on a new computer and software for the presentation computer in the sanctuary.
- 8. **Adjourn:** The meeting adjourned by unanimous agreement at 7:30 PM followed by the Lord's Prayer. The next meeting will be held on January 3, 2025.
