Dear Friends,

On Sunday, June 22<sup>nd</sup>, I shared in worship my intention to retire in mid-October of this year. It's something I've been contemplating and praying over for a while now, but I am all too aware that this move takes others by surprise... maybe you. While I would like to think that I'm self-aware enough not to assume my departure will cause universal weeping and gnashing of teeth, I also understand that after sharing nearly thirteen years of life and ministry together, you, like me, will have some feelings about such a transition. My own grief at the thought of ending my time at OSLC is more than substantial... and yet, my sense that the time is right is stronger still. Here's why:

First, there are other calls upon my life... callings that have all too often been overshadowed by my call as a pastor... that require my attention now. The realities of an aging mother (whose dementia is progressing) and of a brother with cerebral palsy still recovering from a broken hip, both back in Rochester, Minnesota, deserve more of me. Three of our adult children living nearly 700 miles away also figure into that calculus, along with the rest of our extended family network back that way. I'm sure many of you know those realities, too, and what that feels like.

Secondly, I've been non-stop in full-time parish ministry for thirty-five years, now. But even before that, I grew up in a pastor's family. That means that for all of my life, even my "before ordination" life, the rhythms of my day-to-day existence have been dictated and shaped by the church calendar and schedule. While tremendous gifts have accrued to me and my family because of that very thing, there has been a price to be paid. It occurs to me I may have other things to experience before I'm too exhausted to try them.

Finally, and this is important: Deacon Laura Campbell's forthcoming retirement. It would be entirely disingenuous of me to suggest that her departure doesn't figure into my own decision... but perhaps not for the reasons you may imagine. Yes, it would be difficult to envision doing my work without her partnership in it, leaning on her gifts for ministry... specific gifts that are decidedly lacking in me. But that isn't it. Through many transitions I've weathered in staff over the years, I've learned that God raises up new leadership and partnership in ways one could never see coming! It has more to do with the opportunity this presents OSLC at this season in your history. The pastor / deacon arrangement has worked well these past 13 years, and it may be the model carried forward. But it doesn't have to be. As you begin a process of discernment about the future, a different model of leadership may present itself, and the time may be ripe for it. (We'll be sharing more about that process as we get closer to it.)

I can't imagine a better, more fulfilling place to have spent the last trimester of my career as a full-time pastor. Being invited into your joys and sorrows, sharing this life of faith together, means you are family. This we will remain.

Dear friends in Christ,

Perhaps you heard my announcement in worship on Sunday 6/22 of my decision to retire in six weeks. Please know that this decision comes following a long period of prayerful discernment. You may know that decisions are never spur of the moment for me, whether small or large! And I have learned over a lifetime that big decisions take much deliberation time for me. Wise people told me in the past that when one weighs the pros and cons and feels led to one or the other decision, it is important to recognize whether the decision brings you peace. At the age of 70, I certainly know that I could have chosen retirement years ago. But only in these last months has the idea felt peaceful to me. My retirement date is August 1, and my last day in the office will be July 31. I am excited about beginning this new season of life and at the same time sad at what I leave behind.

I have served God with you through the ministry of this place for almost 29 years, first as Lay Minister and in the last eight years as a rostered Deacon, Minister of Word and Service. I have dearly loved my work here. And enjoying God's creative movement in this place has meant that changes over the years kept me energized and passionate about what I do. I leave knowing that there are strong leaders at the helm on Church Council and on every Team/Committee of this congregation. Members of these groups work together joyfully. Together we have created new ministries and opportunities for our people to serve. Personally, I have especially loved empowering and supporting leaders, providing pastoral care, inviting you into a variety of faith practices, and assisting you to recognize your gifts and call to service in this place and out in the world. Believing in the life-giving nature of Christian community, I have loved helping you make connections in this body of Christ.

I intend to stay in Spearfish and will enjoy worshipping in various congregations in our community and conference for the time being. I know that you understand that I will no longer be available to answer calls or walk alongside you as I have in the past. But I trust that God will call great new leadership to do so.

Please know that I love you and will continue to pray for each of you and for the ministry of this vibrant congregation. Know that I will appreciate your prayers as well. I am happy that I have a few more weeks with you before my call at Our Savior's comes to a close.
