Thus says the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel: Amend your ways and your doings, and let me camp with you in this place. Do not trust in these deceptive words: "This is the temple of the LORD, the temple of the LORD, the temple of the LORD." For if you truly amend your ways and your doings, if you truly act justly one with another, ...then I will camp with you in this place, in the land that I gave of old to your ancestors forever and ever.

Jeremiah 7:3-5, 7

Ask any schoolteacher, or any kid, and they'll tell you it's a fact: the last couple weeks of school are the hardest. It's hard to sit in a hot classroom when everything beyond those school walls tells you that summer is here. Keeping kids on task in the advancing days of May is an exercise in futility if there ever was one.

My own kids used to always demand that we set up the camper right away in the summer, even if only in our driveway. To them, nothing spoke of summer like the mildewy smell of canvas and the aroma of old wood-smoke in the camper mattresses. For our family, camping was always a holy thing... not simply an escape from school and work, but a time of very real togetherness. (Try spending a rainy weekend in an 8x11 foot camping trailer or tent sometime if you want to experience real "togetherness." Survive that as a family and you can survive just about anything.)

For me, the best part about camping is the campfire. It's hard to describe it with mere words to someone who has never shared a campfire with anyone else, but that time spent around sputtering, smoking, burning logs is holy time. It's why Chris Blain, in working with our Sr. High youth, frequently invites the group out to his land for a campfire on Wednesdays when they're not at The Living Room. Generally, you don't share a campfire with just anyone. There is an intimacy around a campfire that produces familiarity. This is a good thing among friends. It can be a very not-so-good thing among strangers, depending on what they reveal about themselves to one-another. Around the campfire, it's hard not to be "found out." I don't know why that is. It just is.

In the seventh chapter of Jeremiah, the prophet expresses God's desire to be in the most familiar relationship possible with God's people... to "camp" with them. Most translations use the word "dwell..." but that doesn't capture the true essence of the Hebraic word, which literally means "to tabernacle" or "to tent" with. In order for God to "tent" or to "camp" with folks, those folks have to understand that not just anyone can share God's campfire. If they're going to share God's campfire, they need to share God's concern for compassion and justice. Just like ancient Israel, we can't assume that God is camping out in our church just because we might want to believe it's so. God will be found camping out wherever the Gospel is being done and lived, not simply mouthed.

Something to think about this summer: By the way you live... the way you love... the way you serve... the way you spend... the way you give... the way you worship: is there a place for God at your campfire?

God's blessings for a holy summer!

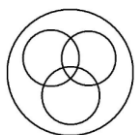

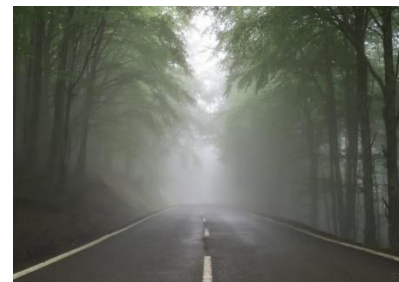

Our Savior's Lutheran Church Council Minutes

May 14, 2024 - 6:17 PM

OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, fellowship, and service through Jesus Christ.

1. **Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order by Pastor Stephan Sandness, at 6:17pm. Members present were Pastor Stephan Sandness, Deacon Laura Campbell, Reed Haug, Karson Klein Mike Steffen, Sherry Kloeckl, David Pummel, Christina Miles, Deming Haugland, Pam Tyma, Brady Harr, and Andy Binder.
2. **What's on Top?:** With the new council meeting for the first time, all present introduced themselves and shared a bit about their present lives.
3. **Devotions:** Pastor Stephan Sandness shared a devotion with notes of the coming Pentecost Sunday and Acts 2. He shared similarities between the first disciples, the presently assembled council, and our church as a whole, being all ordinary people called to service.
4. **Church Council Overview:** Pastor Stephan Sandness gave a short overview of our mission and functions as a church council.
5. **Approve Agenda:** Pam Tyma made a motion to amend and approve the agenda with an addition of item 10b – Tree Removal. Brady Harr seconded, motion carried Agenda approved, as amended.
6. **Election of Officers:** Pastor Stephan Sandness gave a short introduction regarding Church Council officer elections and made note all previous officers remain on council. A short discussion was had about continuing all officer positions as they have been. Mike Steffen moved to elect the slate of officer as they stand with President Andy Binder, Vice-President Deming Haugland, Secretary Nichole Braithwait, and Treasure David Pummel. Sherry Kloeckl seconded; motion carried. All officers will remain the same as last year.
7. **Committee Assignments:** Pastor Stephan Sandness reviewed current committee assignments. Reed Haug will be joining the properties committee, all council members present voiced a willingness to continue as they have. Pastor Stephan Sandness encourages everyone to reach out to him should they wish to change or add to any of their current assignments.
8. **Determine Finance Committee & Personnel Committee:** Pastor Stephan Sandness reviewed responsibilities of the Finance and Personnel Committees. It was noted our outgoing council member had filled a position on the Personnel Committee. Reed Haug agreed to join the Personnel Committee. All other members will remain on their currently assigned rolls with these two committees.
9. **Approval of Minutes for April Council and Annual Meetings:** Pastor Stephan Sandness requested an amendment to the April 9, 2024, council meeting minutes' item 5 – Approval of the February and March Treasurer's Report line three change "\$154K vs \$159K" to "\$152K vs \$139K," to match the report given. Christina Miles moved to approve the meeting minutes as amended. Sherry Kloeckl seconded; motion carried April council meeting minutes are approved as amended. Deming Haugland moved to approve the April 21, 2024, Annual Meeting of the Congregation minutes as presented. Mike Steffen seconded; motion carried the 2024 Annual Meeting of the Congregation are approved.
10. **Treasurer's Report for April:** Davis Pummel shared this year is looking very good and ahead of our typical year to date standings. Year to date income is at \$198,888 vs \$195,123 this time last year. Mike Steffen moved to approve the Treasurer's report as presented. Deming Haugland seconded, motion carried report approved.

11. This process has been going well, with plans to work on hiring a new director near the end of the summer. Pastor Stephan Sandness and all present shared their true heartfelt grateful thanks to the entire group of funeral volunteers and AJ for everything they do.

12. Council Installation Sunday, May 19: Pastor Stephan Sandness reviewed how this year's council installation will proceed this coming Sunday May 19 at both services.

13. Info Item – Council Details: Pastor Stephan Sandness reviewed a few details regarding church council including, mailbox locations, offering assistance, worship & meeting attendance, leadership, & monthly treats & devotions.

14. Adjourn: The meeting adjourned with a motion by Mike Steffen and a second by Andy Binder followed by the Lord's Prayer. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, June 11, 2024, at 6:30pm at Our Savior's Lutheran Church

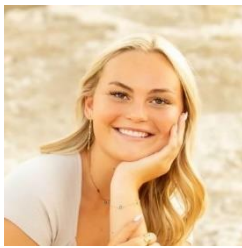

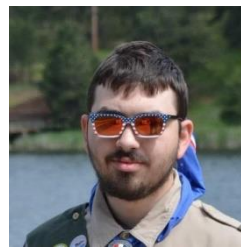

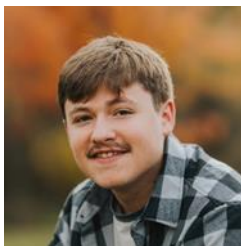

This group will receive an email link to SignUp Genius where you can volunteer for the days and times that work best for you to serve as Welcome Center Host, Usher, Communion Assistant, Snack Provider, and Coffee Server.

Anyone (outside of this group) is also welcome to sign up if you wish! Email sommerlyn.mortensen@gmail.com that you want to receive the link.

Welcome Center Hosts (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by the Welcome Centers (one on each side). Warmly greet each group as they arrive.

Ushers (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by counters by the glass doors of the Sanctuary (one on each side). Welcome each family group or individual as they enter, hand them a bulletin, and assist them to find a seat if necessary. Count all heads in the room and record the number on the chart at the counter. At the time of communion, begin at the **front** and release one row at a time. If there are people in the Southeast section, start them first. Be the last to go up for communion.

Communion assistants (2):

During the Offering, go to the Sacristy behind the altar and wash your hands with soap and water. Pick up a cup for wine. Then come out and stand by the bell cabinet during the Words of Institution and Lord's Prayer. Pastor will serve you communion. He will then give you a tray of bread (wafers). There are also gluten free wafers in small containers on the rail. Follow the pastor's lead to move to the front of the rail. As each person comes to you, place a wafer on their open hand (without touching the person) saying, "The body of Christ, given for you." If the person asks for gluten free, give them one of the bread containers from the rail. Upon finishing, hand the tray back to the pastor.

Snack providers (4):

Bring 4 dozen cookies or bars to the church kitchen by 8 am on Sunday morning (or on Friday by 3 pm prior to your Sunday).

Coffee Servers (2):

Check in with the Kitchen Coordinator (Pam Englund) by 8:15 am to familiarize yourself with the kitchen and to get instructions. She will have coffee and lemonade prepared. Keep the cookie trays in the kitchen until right before serving. Return to the kitchen after communion. Put cookie trays and coffee urns on the serving table. Be ready to serve at 9:30 am. Serve coffee as people come through the line. Near the end of coffee hour, assist the Kitchen Coordinator with cleanup as instructed—putting things away, washing dishes, wiping down tables/chairs.
