Lunch @ The Living Room continues through May 16. We will be on break from May 23 – July, reconvening on August 8.







April 9, 2024 - 6:30 PM

OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, Fellowship and service through Jesus Christ.

- 1. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Andy Binder at 6:22pm. Members present were Pastor Stephan Sandness, Deacon Laura Campbell, Mike Steffen, Nichole Braithwait, Sherry Kloeckl, David Pummel, Christina Miles, Deming Haugland and Brady Harr, Karson Klein, Pam Tyma.
- 2. Devotions: Pam was encouraged by a writing by Kendra Dahl via the website Core Christianity and she talked about how often in life we have so much happening at any one time. We think we have a plan on how it is all going to work out and then plans change or are messed up by something outside of our control. It could be a sickness or an accident or just something that comes up that changes our day-to-day life. In those moments many of us may react with the response "God willing..." as a verbal reminder to ourselves that we will get through whatever it is that has sidetracked us and often this sentiment of "If the Lord wills..." as told to us in James 4: 13-17, can be an act of humility in that moment.
- **3. Approve Agenda:** Deming Haugland made a motion to amend the agenda to update item number four on the agenda from March to February and update number five to approve Treasurer's reports from February and March due to not meeting in March. Year to date we are at \$154K vs \$159K year to date, last year. He noted that there is still \$3K that needs to be moved from endowments from the emergency expenses to help the Woyatan bus this past winter with fuel to continue operating. With that adjustment we are into the positive on the year and a great Easter service really helped with having the extra Sunday in March. Christina Miles made a motion to approve the February and March Treasurer's reports. Brady Harr seconded; motion carried.
- **6. Ministerial Staff Reports:** Deacon Laura passed on that groups are wrapping up activities. Bible study and book groups are finishing up and everyone is looking forward to the "summer pace." She mentioned to keep eyes out for all our new families and help welcome them to the congregation. A welcome supper for all new members is occurring on Thursday, 11 April at 5:45pm. She also passed on a huge thank you to everyone who helped with Easter Sunday.

Pastor Stephan passed on that we are planning for an 8 May, Wednesday Word service over at The Living Room, followed by an ice cream social. The Living Room is undergoing renovations and we would love to get the congregation over to see and be a part of the remodel efforts! He talked about Easter and lent being a very busy and successful season this year and added that on top of that, there were five funerals in March. He passed on his thanks to the people who do such a wonderful job walking beside people in their time of grief. The hospitality that the funeral team offers is a lot of work, but it brings huge blessings and benefits. It is both and enlivening and draining situation. Additionally, Pastor passed on that Holy Week and Easter were wonderful and he is looking ahead to what he hopes is a season of calm as Sunday School, Confirmation and Wednesday Suppers are all ending for the season. Campus Ministry passed on that they "have a pulse" and are making good progress bring that program back up to speed. They have a completed constitution and are encouraging members to refer anybody who they may know to join. The board should be in place soon and discussions about the Director position are ongoing. Progress is slow, but positive.

Welcome Center Hosts (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by the Welcome Centers (one on each side). Warmly greet each group as they arrive.

Ushers (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by counters by the glass doors of the Sanctuary (one on each side). Welcome each family group or individual as they enter, hand them a bulletin, and assist them to find a seat if necessary. Count all heads in the room and record the number on the chart at the counter. At the time of communion, begin at the **front** and release one row at a time. If there are people in the Southeast section, start them first. Be the last to go up for communion.

Communion assistants (2):

During the Offering, go to the Sacristy behind the altar and wash your hands with soap and water. Pick up a cup for wine. Then come out and stand by the bell cabinet during the Words of Institution and Lord's Prayer. Pastor will serve you communion. He will then give you a tray of bread (wafers). There are also gluten free wafers in small containers on the rail. Follow the pastor's lead to move to the front of the rail. As each person comes to you, place a wafer on their open hand (without touching the person) saying, "The body of Christ, given for you." If the person asks for gluten free, give them one of the bread containers from the rail. Upon finishing, hand the tray back to the pastor.

Snack providers (4):

Bring 4 dozen cookies or bars to the church kitchen by 8 am on Sunday morning (or on Friday by 3 pm prior to your Sunday).

Coffee Servers (2):

Check in with the Kitchen Coordinator (Pam Englund) by 8:15 am to familiarize yourself with the kitchen and to get instructions. She will have coffee and lemonade prepared. Keep the cookie trays in the kitchen until right before serving. Return to the kitchen after communion. Put cookie trays and coffee urns on the serving table. Be ready to serve at 9:30 am. Serve coffee as people come through the line. Near the end of coffee hour, assist the Kitchen Coordinator with cleanup as instructed—putting things away, washing dishes, wiping down tables/chairs.
