

First Communion Instruction

Thursday, September 18 at 6:30 PM and Sunday, September 21 at 1:00 PM with First Communion on September 28

Each fall we invite a new group of young people to learn more about the sacrament of the Lord's Supper. We've mailed out an invitation to all kids entering fifth grade (or older are welcome, if they haven't previously been a part of the class) and their parents. We meet for two brief sessions, during which we explore the history and meanings behind the celebration of Holy Communion. (On a personal note, this is one of my favorite classes to teach! We have a good time!) These sessions are designed with



parent/child conversation in mind, so it's important that at least one parent be here with the student. (As a bonus, it really ends up being a good opportunity for adults to brush up on their own understanding of the Lord's Supper!)

This year, our two classes will be held Thursday, September 18 at 6:30 P.M. and on Sunday, September 21 at 1:00 P.M. Our second session also includes an opportunity for the kids to bake communion bread for use in worship at their First Communion on Sunday, September 28. Mark your calendar!

*IMPORTANT NOTE: If you have a child younger than fifth-grade age who has been showing an active desire to partake of the Sacrament, you as their parent may elect to bring them to these sessions as well. We already have a number of children partaking of Holy Communion earlier than fifth grade. (We aren't constitutionally, confessionally or scripturally bound to any particular age with regard to readiness for Communion. History has dictated our custom, with some Christians communing early and others later. Parents in conversation with me can determine their child's readiness.)

2 long or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet), 1 hand towel, dark color recommended, 2 receiving blankets, 2 lightweight cotton t-shirts, 4 cloth diapers, 2 pairs of socks, 2 bath-size bars of gentle soap, in original wrapping, 2 diaper pins, 1 jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood or include a baby cap

Wrap items in one of the receiving blankets and secure with the safety pins. Gently used, clean items can be substituted for new ones. An entire kit gets kind of expensive, single items really help as well. Do not enclose kit in plastic bags

August 12, 2025 - 6:30 PM; the Conference Room

OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, fellowship, and service through Jesus Christ.

- 1. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Pastor Stephan at 6:35 pm. Members present were Andy Binder, Sherry Kloeckl, Pam Tyma, Laura Bosworth, David Pummel, Lana Main, Deming Haugland, Pastor Stephan Sandness. Attending via ZOOM were Mike Steffen, Karson Klein. Special guest Pastor Randy Fett.
- **2. What's on top**: Members spoke about summer vacations, country songs, fishing, jobs, and back to school schedules!
- **3. Devotions**: Pastor Stephan read from Hebrews the 11th Chapter. Perseverance comes before us Clouds of witnesses remains. He remembers the pep talks from his college cross country coach using these texts as he begins his transition and reflection.
- **4. Action Item-**The agenda was approved as presented. Deming Haugland moved. Pam Tyma seconded. Motion carried.
- **5. Action Item-**Approval of June and July Council minutes. Sherry Kloeckl moved to approve as presented. Pam Tyma seconded. Motion carried.
- 6. Action Item- June/July Treasurers reports were presented by David Pummel. Nothing extraordinary was noted, dedicated accounts are all looking good. June income was \$43,872.84 with expenses of\$46,966.70. YTD income sits at \$310,069.37 with expenses of \$303,930.89. Leaving us with a current surplus of \$6,138.48. Laura Bosworth moved to approve report as presented. Deming Haugland seconded. Motion carried. July income was \$44,451.96 with expenses of \$49,555.13. YTD income sits at \$354,521.33 with expenses of \$353,486.22. Leaving us with a surplus of \$1,035.11. Deming Haugland moved to approve as presented. Laura Bosworth seconded. Motion carried. Added note, all fellowship chairs are bought and paid for! A hearty thanks to all that made this "comfortable" upgrade happen for us all!!
- 7. Ministerial Staff Reports: Only one this month! Pastor Stephan reported on a beautiful service in the park with 350 in attendance. Weather was perfect, food was great and fellowship was a blessing for our faithful Deacon Laura's send off into retirement. He returned from vacation to officiate at seven funerals. He stated how in awe of the funeral kitchen committee he is and the job they do in ministering to the families and friends of the grieving. How our fellowship hall becomes a family reunion of sorts. Job well done ladies! He has also done several baptisms, with a wedding scheduled in September. August began the wrap-up transition that will lead into the busy month of September. Beginning of school, confirmation, and then full hand off to our Interim Minister in October. Confirmation and youth group will be led by Chris Blain.
- 8. Committee Updates- Mission Team: Clothe A Kid shared church's donation was \$7700. Diaper drive for Pine Ridge has been completed.
